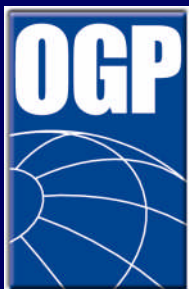
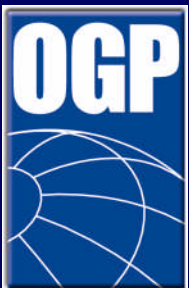

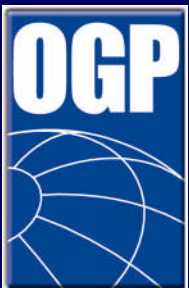
Profile

- Offices in London and Brussels



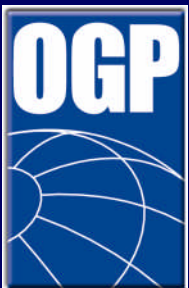
Vision

- To work on behalf of all the world's upstream companies to promote responsible and profitable operations



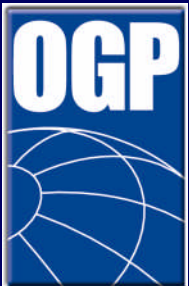
Mission

- To promote awareness of corporate social responsibility within the industry and among stakeholders



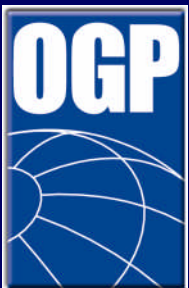
Advocacy

- London-based OGP is the upstream industry's primary representative to international regulatory and legislative bodies such as the UN's International Maritime Organization. OGP also works with the World Bank and with the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and is accredited to a range of regional bodies such as OSPAR and the Arctic Council.
- From its office in Brussels, OGP provides an essential link for advocacy and debate with the European Union through regular contact with the European Commission and European Parliament



Best practices

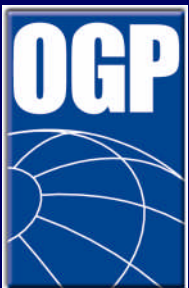
- Benchmarking, eg safety, environmental and health performance databases

- Best practice in environmental & social impact assessment



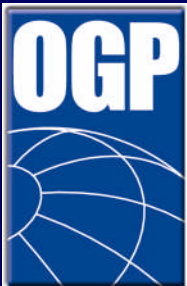
Membership

Membership open to

- Privately, publicly or state-owned upstream companies
- Any association (regional, national or international) of two or more OGP Members which is concerned directly with the upstream business

Associate membership open to:

- Companies, other corporate bodies and national institutions which provide oil- and/or gas-field services to a company which qualifies for OGP membership



How OGP works

- Network of committees, subcommittees, task forces and work groups. Headed by Management Committee
- Twice yearly general meetings for members. Additionally, many workshops organised
- Secretariat of 15 people
